Serpell Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you that Serpell's voluntary Parent Financial Contribution for 2025 will be \$200, this will include your child's stationery supplies that will be used in class and brought home at the end of the school year.

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS (SSB) - the Department of Education Portal that was emailed to you This year the State Government is giving every Victorian student who attends a public school a School Saving Bonus (SSB) of \$400 to be used for Excursions, Incursions, Camp, Swimming or Uniform purchases. It **can not** be used for anything else.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ITEMS AND ACTIVITIES (compulsory)

- Our Excursion/Incursion Levy is \$80 for <u>all year levels</u>. This amount covers all excursion and incursions that your child participates in.
- An additional \$60 Senior School Sport Levy for <u>year 6</u> students to cover the Interschool Sport program.
- You will need to allocate your Excursion Levy first on your SSB portal.

HEALTH CARE CARD HOLDERS

• If you have a valid Health Care Card you are entitled to the Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund (CSEF) of \$150 and you do **NOT** need to allocate the Excursion/Incursion levy from the SSB, it will be allocated by the school once your CSEF application is approved with Centrelink in early 2025.

As one of the top 5 performing schools in Victoria, our school payments are exceptionally low when compared to other schools and we strive to keep costs to a minimum for our families. In 2024, close to 100% of our families paid, which meant that we all shared resources equally.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Serpell Primary offers a range of items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides in order to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis and will be offered throughout the year such as swimming, camps (year 3 to 6), excursions and incursions.

- You will need to select to allocate the Excursion/Incursion Levy \$80 (all year levels) <u>plus \$60 for year 6 only</u> to cover the Senior School Interschool Sport Competition through your School Saving Bonus (SSB) portal.
- If you are have a valid Commonwealth Government Health Care Card and have submitted an application to the school, the school will allocate your Excursion/Incursion Levy payment from this <u>DO NOT</u> allocate from your SSB.

Financial Support for Families:

Serpell understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) for eligible Health Care Card Holders
- State School Relief (SSR)
- School Saving Bonus (SSB) every child will receive \$400 in 2025 for excursions & uniforms
