RETIRING SCHOOL COUNCILLORS – THANKYOU

At the end of 2024, several of our parents who had been outstanding and generous school councillors completed their time on the Serpell Council due to their children moving on to secondary schools or family relocation. We thank them each for their service and the development of our school over recent years. We wish them well at their new schools, where we are certain that they will continue to make a positive difference.

<u>Marjan Hajjari</u> has been our School Council President for the past four years, a councillor for eight and a Serpell parent for thirteen years. In her time as President, Council has overseen the building of the Music Room and the construction of the outdoor shade cover over the basketball courts. These two projects alone cost \$2m. Marjan has been a positive, stable and influential council President, and we have appreciated her professional expertise, organisational capabilities, cohesive leadership skills and warm friendship.

<u>Flora Liu</u> has been an excellent Treasurer who retired mid-way through the year. She provided Council with a deep understanding of financial processes and gave advice on matters such audit recommendations, financial policy and budgeting.

In that time, she has supported the Council with advice on energy conservation and organised access to a program for students which gave them experience in the construction of solar powered light devices for students in remote communities.

<u>Lauren Faulker</u> was the teacher representative for the past four years and provided advice on educational program and school events. She has taken leave for 2025.
